Джаферани е президент на Асоциацията по психодерматология в Северна Америка, съпредседател на Първия световен конгрес по психодерматология – 2025, Истанбул, председател на научните и организационни комитети на Годишната сесия на Американската асоциация по психодерматология и председател на Световния ден по психодерматология. Той има над 195 научни публикации в рецензирани списания и е автор и рецензент на 12 книги по психокутанна медицина, включително "Педиатрична психодерматология", "Гериатрична психодерматология", "Стрес и кожа", "Трихотиломания", "Основи на психодерматологията", "Ръководство по психодерматология", "Психотрихология" и "Клинична психодерматология".

Prof. Dr. Mohammad Jafferany is a professor of psychodermatology, psychiatry, and behavioral sciences at Central Michigan University College of Medicine. He is the president of the Psychodermatology Association of North America. He is currently the chairperson of World Psychodermatology Day, co-chair of the First World Congress of Psychodermatology 2025, and chair of the scientific and organizing committees of the 2025 American Psychodermatological Association Annual Meeting. Prof. Jafferany has more than 195 scholarly texts and publications to his credit on various topics in psychodermatology in peer-reviewed journals. He has edited and authored 12 books on psychocutaneous medicine, such as: Pediatric psychodermatology, Geriatric psychodermatology, Stress and skin, Trichotillomania, Essentials of psychodermatology, Handbook of psychodermatology, Psychotrichology, and Clinical psychodermatology.
