At the beginning of her professional career, she worked as a nurse in Brzozów and Sanok hospitals. Then as a teacher at the Medical Post-Secondary School, and since 2003 at the State University of Jan Grodek in Sanok. At the University, she was the director of the Medical Institute, later the vice-rector for didactics, in the years 2012-2020 she was the rector, and currently she is the vice-rector of the University.

Author of numerous articles, chapters in monographs, editor or co-editor of collective works, participant of numerous national and international conferences. She has participated many times in European and other international programs.
